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RESOLUTION NO. 10093 [Signature]

WHEREAS, the Article IX-C, Section 2(4) of the 1987 Constitution empowers the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) to deputize, with the concurrence of the President, law enforcement agencies and instrumentalities of the government for the exclusive purpose of ensuring free, orderly, honest, peaceful and credible elections;

WHEREAS, COMELEC Resolution No. 10077 was promulgated to create the Sub-committee on Security Concerns which shall conduct risk analysis and ascertain risk factors and vulnerabilities related to security issues affecting the conduct of the May 9, 2016 National and Local Elections, which shall be used in identifying Election Watchlist of Areas, and its recommendations shall be submitted to the CBFSP;

WHEREAS, COMELEC Resolution No. 10020 was promulgated to deputize the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM), Philippine National Police (PNP) and other law enforcement agencies to ensure honest, orderly, peaceful and credible conduct of the May 9, 2016 National and Local Elections;

WHEREAS, COMELEC Resolution No. 10023 was promulgated on 03 December 2015 to deputize the National Electrification Administration, the National Power Corporation and the Local Electrification Cooperatives to ensure reliability of power and continuous supply of energy during the May 9, 2016 National and Local Elections;

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
WHEREAS, COMELEC Resolution No. 10067 was promulgated on 01 March 2016 to deputize the Department of Energy (DOE), Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), the Philippine National Police (PNP), Department of National Defense (DND), The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), and other law enforcement agencies, certain departments under the Executive Branch, government-owned and controlled corporations to assist in securing the nationwide transmission infrastructure and facilities to ensure reliability of power in connection with the May 9, 2016 National and Local Elections;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission **RESOLVED**, as it hereby **RESOLVES**, in addition to the agencies deputized in COMELEC Resolution Nos. 10020, 10021, 10022, 10023, 10067 and 10077, to further deputize the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) and Bureau of Customs (BOC) to act as members of the Sub-committee on Security Concerns and perform functions to address matters related to security issues and concerns as indicated in Resolution No. 10077.

Let the Committee on the Ban on Firearms and Security Personnel (CBFSP) implement this Resolution.

The Education and Information Department is hereby directed to cause the publication of this Resolution in two (2) daily newspapers of general circulation in the Philippines, and to furnish with copies thereof the Regional Election Directors, Provincial Election Supervisors and Election Officers of the Commission, the Philippine National Police (PNP), the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) and all other law enforcement agencies.
